C. Roll Call

Upon roll call by Clerk Cosby, President Burket and Trustees Bhagwakar, Christiansen, Duncan, Simon, and Thompson answered “Present.” Trustee Kalinich was absent.

D. Presentation

Assistant Village Engineer Peebles spoke about the ADA transition plan made in conjunction with the Chicago Metropolitan Authority on Planning (CMAP). He said they were at the end of the process. He turned the presentation over to Travis Helmkamp with consultant Oates & Associates.

Mr. Helmkamp talked about the project schedule, ADA requirements, sidewalk and traffic signals evaluation, and other details in the plan, including the budget. He continued with next steps and the need to constantly evaluate the situation.

As the liaison to the Capital Improvements Commission, Trustee Simon spoke about the need to have this plan in place because it makes the community safer. She acknowledged the hard work of staff on this plan.

Trustee Thompson asked about the grievance process and public comment/suggestions and what should be the process to address these. Assistant Village Engineer Peebles replied.

Trustee Thompson talked about how the See Click Fix app works well for residents to report and manage resident requests.

Trustee Christiansen asked about additional ADA parking spaces and how they need to be addressed. Assistant Village Engineer Peebles replied. Mr. Helmkamp added comments.

Trustee Christiansen pointed out that the Historic Preservation Commission also designates landmarks and encouraged residents to apply if they think their home might qualify.
